Blue H USA proposal holds much promise

I attended the March 10 press conference that Blue H USA held regarding its wind farm proposal. This information must be provided to the public, especially when there is a call of "right idea, wrong location" regarding Cape Wind. The deepwater differentiates from the proposed shallow-water wind turbines in so many ways; it is a win-win proposal.

The turbines would be floated with weights instead of piled into the seabed and can be moved if they are found to interfere with migrating birds or transportation needs or pose any unforeseen problems. The turbines would be completely constructed on land and towed out to sea; there would be no massive construction at sea as with shallow-water turbines, and uses less steel. The turbines would not be visible from the shoreline. The wind is more reliant and stronger.

This technology wasn't available seven years ago when Cape Wind began the process, but it is available now and needs to be looked at as an alternative - not as an addition, which Cape Wind advocates.
